
Third Sunday in Advent (Gaudete) December 15th, 2024

To experience attack, therefore, is quite a different thing from consenting to it or saying "Yes" to it. We must all experience it, though not to the same degree; some have more frequent and sever attacks than others. Young people, for example, are tempted chiefly by the flesh; adults and older people are tempted by the world. Others, who are concerned with spiritual matters (that is, strong Christians), are tempted by the devil. But no one can be harmed by merely experiencing an attack, as long as it is contrary to our will and we would prefer to be rid of it. For if we did not experience it, it could not be called an attack. But to consent to it is to give it free rein and neither to resist it nor to pray for help against it.
